These are the two things that have a profound impact on our sport. We do archery because we enjoy it and some of us end up at club shoots, tournaments and even international tournaments representing Australia.



The balance of enjoyment and anxiety is a tricky one and everyone handles situations in their own way.



The idea is to shoot "in the zone" around the peak of the above curve for events that are important to you.

How you achieve this is a personal journey but Clint Freeman's advice of "*Practice like you shoot and shoot like you practice*." is a great start. It simply means do the same thing when you practice as when you shoot an event. Watch what you eat, drink and have the same routine for preparation, setup, shooting, pack up and wind-down.

How does a coach know this balance is out? The archer says things like "I can do this at practice but not at a tournament" or "The practice ends were okay but the first scoring end was terrible" etc.

Archers always put pressure on themselves to get personal bests or win. The first few times you try something new should be taken as a learning experience without the pressure of performance.

That way you still get the enjoyment before you knuckle down to achieve your performance goals.


