This is an end of year count of members from 1993 to 2009 and then 2019 current members.

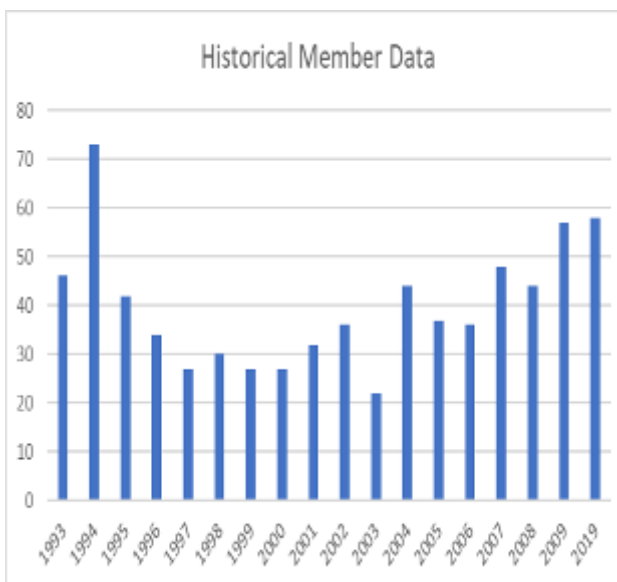

### Member Profile



**W**ay back in 1976 my mum was trying to get me interested in some form of sport so I said how about gun shooting. After the response of having no guns in this house, mum did agree to archery! After

my first lesson I was hooked. I even found an old archery target in a storeroom at school and managed to talk the principal into letting me do archery with my own bow instead of running around a footy field!

My first club was Yarra Bowmen in Victoria and I eventually held positions there of club coach and president for a few years. As an under 18 shooting recurve I entered as many tournaments as I could and did ok. After a few years break in the mid 80s I got the bug again. By that time compound bows were beginning to get a footing and after thinking that looked pretty cool, I crossed to the dark side!

Shooting a compound I had a great deal of success in the late 80s and early 90s and held Australian tournament and distance records for most rounds. I also wrote regular bow reviews for Archery Action magazine in a time before the internet and YouTube. My most memorable shoot was a World IFAA in 2006 where I placed 12th and shot my first perfect round.

I joined Paringa first in about 1995 after moving to Tassie and was really impressed by the set up and friendliness of all in the club. Unfortunately I had to give

up archery for a while due to a medical problem where I couldn't even lift a bow let alone draw one! I re joined the club in the past 2 years and started shooting again. I can certainly say that once you have the bug it never goes away. I don't get down to the club much due to shift work away from home but retirement is rolling ever closer and I hope to get more involved. I can say that over many years I have seen many different clubs, and what we have here at Paringa is one of the best.

I just picked up a gold, three silvers and a bronze at the Australian Masters Games. Gold was for field, silvers were for 3D, unmarked field, and indoor, and the bronze for IFAA field. I won't mention target and clout, they are best left forgotten. 😊

### Australian Masters Games

Congratulations are also due to Peter Mul-Holland who achieved some excellent results in the recent Australian Masters Games in Adelaide. He won Gold in the marked WA Field, Silver in the Unmarked WA Field, Silver in the 3D Field (a dead heat for first only resolved on countback) and Bronze in the IFAA Field - all in the 50-59 male compound division. Well done Peter.

### Target QRE

On Sunday the 13th October, we held a Target QRE and seven archers shot, 3 compound and 4 recurve. We enjoyed perfect weather conditions and Damian Clark managed to break his personal best for the WA50/720 round by a considerable margin, not once but twice, finishing up with 667.

### National Archery Champs

At the end of the October, two of our members, Jeff Garner and Geoff Dyer, will travel over to Morwell in Victoria for the National champs. This event covers outdoor target (1440 rounds), Short course (60/900 round), Marked Field and Clout. As usual, Tassie representation, at nine archers in 169 total, is punching well above our weight. For those of you thinking of having a go at the nationals, remember you don't have to qualify, only enter and, next year, both junior and senior events are being held in Burnie so this is your chance!

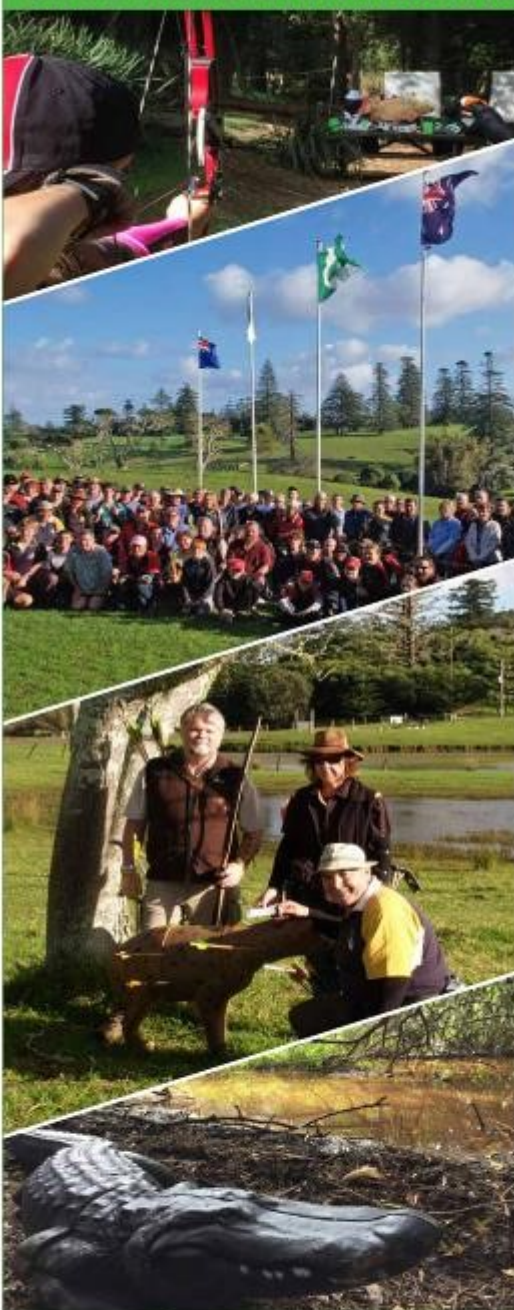

**T**he Royal Company of Archers is a ceremonial unit that serves as the Sovereign's Bodyguard in Scotland, a role it has performed since 1822 during the reign of King George IV, when the company provided a personal bodyguard to the King on his visit to Scotland.

It is currently known as the **Queen's Bodyguard For Scotland**, and is located in Edinburgh, the capital city. The Royal Company of Archers has a long history in Scotland as a body that celebrated both the recreation and talent of local archers. As a body established by the Monarch, the Company has a long history of unique prizes, influential supporters, and ceremonial roles.

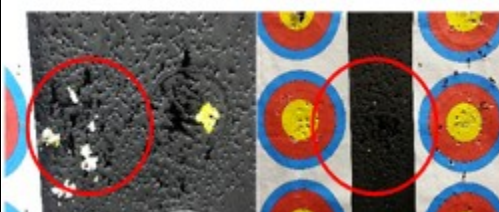
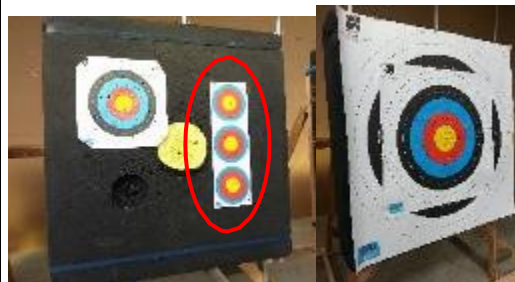

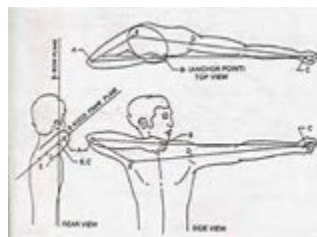
## Member Club Coaching



**T**he **Formaster** training aid is a much miss under-

stood device. Most people think it's supposed to force your body into the correct form for archery. This is not correct. The Formaster is a device you can use to get feedback on your archery form and help correct it.

We want correct archery form so that we are in the best position to handle the forces archery places on our upper body. This is not about being an Olympic archer but all about being able to shoot for many years without injury or discomfort. Rotator cuff, tendonitis and carpal tunnel syndrome are all injuries that can be associated with bad archery form.



Feedback with the **Formaster** comes from shooting an arrow while the device is attached to the bow. Correct form will have the arrow leave the bow in a straight line and land a few meters in front of the bow while the archer maintains their form.

If the arrow goes right/left or your bow arm elbow goes forward, then these are indicators of bad form or technique. With finger tabs you can have good form but still have a bad release causing a bad shot. You could also have incorrect bow hand pressure causing the bow to twist when you release.

It's not always one thing and informed feedback from a coach can go a long way to understanding what you need to work on.

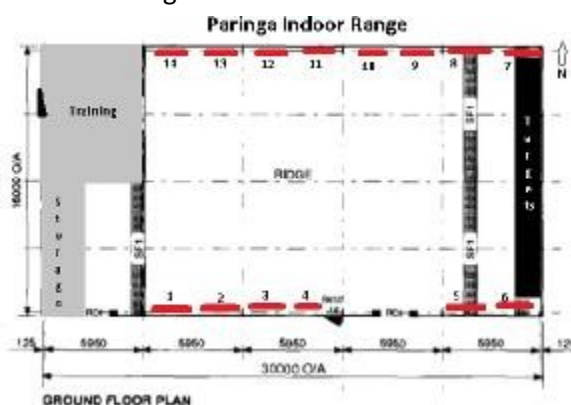

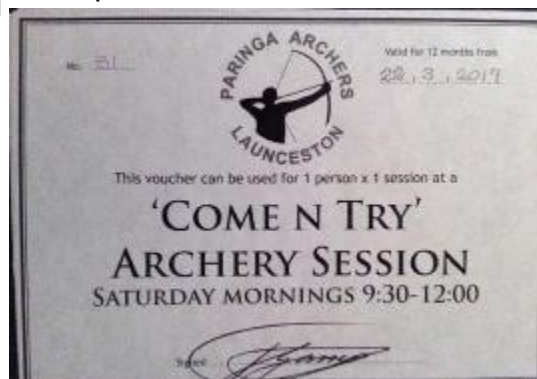
