



AST Meeting 12/3/2017

1. AST has paid registrations for 3 people to attend a **Kisik Lee training course**. They are to pass on this knowledge.

2. AA has distributed some **ARROWS kits** from Archery GB for very young children to safely try archery. Full kits are \$800 (10 bows, 30 arrows, 4 targets (conventional on back)), and smaller kits are available, or a full kit could be split between clubs. AST will ask AA for more, or clubs might like to consider purchasing. See this site for more information: <u>http://archeryexperience.co.uk</u>



3. A **Judges** training seminar will be scheduled in Burnie for late July. Additionally, Judges discussions online will be floated in late March.

4. **Award claims** have been simplified, with scoresheets only needed by the AST Recorder for major awards such as Elite or 1450 awards (club recorder should have exact details).

5. The **state youth team** is preparing for the Youth Nationals well.

Rabbit of the Month


This section is dedicated to notable actions that members may on occasion happen to do.
