Indoor Project:

- The WTC regards this as a commercial project which could increase overall compliance requirements and resulting costs.
- Community Fund grant applications close 5 April (max \$90k). Treasurer applying.
- Hobart Archers' quarterly power costs are around \$200. Being a commercial connection, a higher rate applies so we may expect similar.
- Petition is circulating both online and paper version at clubhouse to show community support for the project as part of applications.

WTC volunteer awards are now open. No interest.

Expired memberships:

After 4 months a lapsed membership can be renewed from date of expiry (medals/claims won during the interim can then be claimed) or from date of renewal. There should be an option in the online renewal process.

Non-members:

Non-members, with [Temporary Memberships](#), can only shoot in an organised club Come N Try or instruction activity with AA Instructor supervision ie. Saturday Come n Try sessions. Otherwise it poses an unacceptable insurance risk.

The Final Say

Archery Australia provides 5 different insurance policies to support archers and clubs. The most obvious is Public Liability which covers you as an archer if you injure someone or are injured while shooting or have any other mishap on the club grounds, but there are others which protect coaches and club administrators from liability through Professional Indemnity, Management

Liability, Errors and Omissions and Product Liability cover.

Everyone on an archery field needs to be insured. If you are not insured and something bad happens you could lose your house or your health without compensation.

If your coach isn't an Archery Australia coach and you aren't an Archery Australia member there is no AA insurance coverage to either of you if you are hurt by poor advice given, unless the coach has their own Professional Indemnity insurance.

Make sure you know what your club membership covers you for. If you are an Archery Australia member you are fully covered.

Temporary Membership is firstly intended for NON MEMBERS of Archery Australia who are taking part in an instruction course or Archery Come N Try.

Temporary Membership is also intended for visitors. These could be visitors or Archery Alliance members who are NOT currently registered with Archery Australia but wish to shoot at your club/RGB or enter an Cross Participation event.

By making visitors Temporary Members both the non member and your club/RGB is covered for insurance, but again, Temporary membership does NOT replace Full Membership. Temporary Membership provides no rights or privileges other than Public Liability insurance coverage.

IMPORTANT POINTS

- All **NON MEMBERS** taking part in an instruction activity, irrespective of the duration of the course, must take out Temporary Membership.
- For people undertaking instruction there is a maximum of 12 visits permitted.
- Temporary membership is not Associate membership.
- A visitor or Archery Alliance member can attend a **maximum of 4 times in a year**. If a visitor wishes to visit more than 4 times

in a year they should consider joining the club.

- At all times, Temporary Membership for the purpose of instruction or as a visitor/cross participation are two separate activities and cannot be combined.

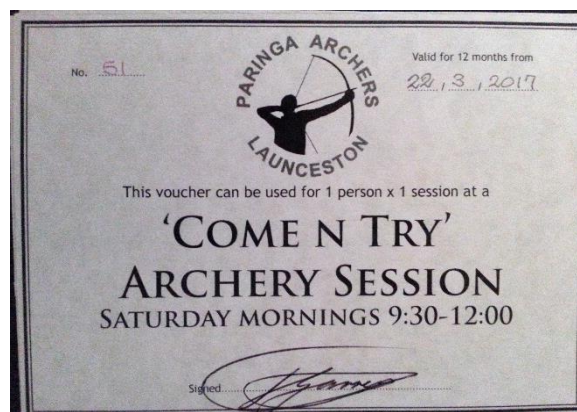
