Of course, the three "wise" men (Huey, Dewey and Louie) were also there to make up the numbers. I hope I got their names right or Tim, Geoff and Richard won't be happy!

Treasurer

A few people have commented that the target butts need some repair. Well at the next working bee you will have the opportunity to lend a hand to repairs some.

Remember \$65 of your membership is for target butts and faces each year. 60 members at \$65 is only \$3,900 and we spend about \$2k of that on target faces each year. We recently bought 24 cores (\$672) for the compound target butts (each

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butt takes 12 cores) in the Indoor Range, as a third have been shot out in only three months. If we don't repair cores, then the Indoor Range could end up costing the club around \$3k a year in replaceable cores alone.

It doesn't take a rocket scientist to realise the facilities members enjoy are heavily subsidised by the income volunteers generate and members fees barely cover operational and maintenance costs.

The club also needs to rebuild contingency reserves back to \$15k while at the same time covering operational costs. This money comes from the work of the volunteer members and will take some time (Approx 12 months) from Come N Trys, Groups and External events. Contingency reserves are funds the club keeps for self-insuring (contents) and for unforeseen events, like being asked to vacate the lease area. Being asked to "move on" happened at the St Leonards grounds.

Front Gate Flag and Sign

club grounds, then make sure the flag and sign are down and the gate is locked. You don't need a key to lock the gate as the lock is left unlocked and just pushes closed.

Dear Ben.,

Re: Smoking control warning email, 7/5/18

Thank you for the warning email informing us of the complaint lodged with your Department.

While Paringa Archers had already instigated smoking policies in line with the Act, your evidence demonstrates our difficulties with enforcement. The penalty information you have provided has been a catalyst at club meeting for the adoption of two major policy changes.

The first resolved to make the entire Paringa Archers leasehold smoke free, which overcame potential confusion in the definitions of both the 20 meter rule, and the term "event".

The second developed a policy of mandatory reporting and escalation of response. The adopted policy states,

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"Anyone seen smoking will be approached by two member to ask them to stop. Those two members are required to note the event in the day book. The Director of Shooting has authority to remove the offender from the shooting line, and eject them from the leasehold, if required. Should the smoker not comply and be a club member, they will be referred to the club executive for enforcement of Archery Australia's disciplinary policies." Carried unanimously

We believe these steps will ensure future compliance.

Roster Group Duties for Come'n'Try Sessions
For the successful running of the Come and Try
public sessions the following duties need to be

carried out. The first person in the roster list for the day will be in charge. This club member will allocate tasks for each of the other members on roster for the day.

Duties

- Arrive between 8:30 am and 9:00 am to set up equipment, signage and targets
- The member in charge will allocate duties
- Set up bows, arrows, ground quivers, official table, target faces, move target butts as required, check drink trolley for drinks and chocolates and <u>leave the</u> trolley in the clubhouse
- Assign DOS for the day
- One member will remain at club house to sign in visitors and give out equipment. At busy times a second member will assist
- All other members will go to help on the line
- Assist in running the shoot. Do not shoot whilst on duty
- At the end of the session put away all equipment not required for other events.
- Unstring bows from the **top limb** only
- Put signage away.
- Make sure eight target butts are on the 10/30m line (unless directed otherwise)
- ALL DAMAGED ARROWS ARE TO BE REPAIRED, replace broken nocks and missing/damaged fletches (at least two members on duty should know how to repair arrows). Arrows with more significant damage, such as shaft damage, will be left in the clubhouse for repair
- Empty rubbish containers (if more than half full) – on the line and in the club house
- All money collected for the day are to be given to the Treasurer or his/her representative.

Member Club Coaching

Even though archery is an 80% mental sport you still need to pay attention to your equipment and make sure you give yourself the best chance of making consistent shots. It's hard enough when everything is working in your favour!

Some things to keep an eye on:

Bows can develop cracks from fatigue, parts can work loose and limbs can delaminate. Plunger buttons wear and the springs weaken or break. Arrow rests or clickers move with use or aren't

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adjusted when different arrows are used. Sights get bent and out of alignment when shooting different distances. Knocking points move and the serving unravels or wears through.

Arrows wear down with constant abrasion in targets (ground, safety wall, target butts etc) and cracks may develop in the shaft. Knocks become loose over time, some may develop cracks or get damaged by arrows hitting them. Fletches/vanes get damaged, come loose or come off completely. Points and knocks come loose and come out when fired, hitting the target (etc) or when being removed from the target.

Then there are finger tabs and release aids to check and maintain as well as arm and chest guards.

Be vigilant and check your gear before you shoot, while you shoot and after you shoot. It may just save you a nasty surprise while shooting. Just ask Matt Everett how a release aid failure affected his shooting.

No wonder archers keep blaming their equipment!



So, what <u>could</u> change with having the NBN?


- Live scoring using local WiFi

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


