### Paringa Archers EOFY 2018

Member would have received my email discussing the need to make changes with how the club manages income and expenditure.

As a Not for Profit club all income above our expenses (surplus) is invested back into the club. Of course, if there is no surplus then expenses must be reduced to achieve a breakeven position. There is no magic pot of gold.

Beginner courses don't bring any extra income as they just substitute for the Come N Try income that would have been generated anyway, with the prior membership process.

Volunteers do bring extra income into the club via Come N Trys, Groups and External Events. Volunteer income cannot be relied on but in the past has provided the club with funds to do minor and major capital projects.

2018 was a good year for the club with a major upgrade to facilities and a clearer focus on community engagement with Facebook.

This year I have only included the figures as the Indoor Project skewed the graphs. These are unaudited, but I do not anticipate any material changes.

The Formaster training aid is a much miss understood device. Most people think it's supposed to force your


body into the correct form for archery. This is not correct. The Formaster is a device you can use to get feedback on your archery form and help correct it.

We want correct archery form so that we are in the best position to handle the forces archery places on our upper body. This is not about being an Olympic archer but all about being able to shoot for many years without injury or discomfort.

Rotator cuff. tendonitis and carpal tunnel syndrome are all injuries that can be associated with bad archery form.

You can be a world

class archer with bad form but you will pay the price eventually.

Unless you are confident with what you are doing you should use a Formaster with your coach to get instruction on its application and your form correction.

Feedback with the Formaster comes from shooting an arrow while the device is attached to the bow. Correct form will have the arrow leave the bow in a straight line and land a few meters in front of the bow while the archer maintains their form.

If the arrow goes right/left or your bow arm elbow goes forward, then these are indicators of bad form or technique. With finger tabs you can have good form but still have a bad release causing a bad shot. You could also have incorrect bow hand pressure causing the bow to twist when you release.

It's not always one thing and informed feedback from a coach can go a long way to understanding what you need to work on.

For a simple explanation on back tension and form have a look at this YouTube video.



Barrie Peers and myself put up some fencing, donated by Paul Malinowski, along the path.


Brian Swinton came up one Wednesday and repaired all the Come N Try arrows that have been let go over time.


Michael Hinds stuck on some 122cm replacement centres while waiting for the Friday night indoor shoot.




