## Social shoots

### Decathlon

Well we started off the year in typical fashion for the decathlon shoot.  
An early start time to setup ensured the day ran smoothly.  
We were met with nice weather and an even better bunch of people to spend the day with.  
We had 16 starters which was awesome.  
There were more than a few faces that couldn't make the day and they were missed.  
The competition was the closest it has been with many archers holding their breath for personal and family pride.

Great scores across the board on an ever changing target setup.

During practise on the hanging ball, PK was happily plinking away at the target.  
1st arrow hit, 2nd arrow glances off the surface of the ball, 3rd arrow hit, 4th arrow hit, 5th arrow hits the target but it just sounds different, I said it sounded a bit like aluminium more than rubber, 6th arrow just off and into the target butt - The hanging ball had claimed it's one and only arrow for the day!

The sound we heard was PK cutting his own arrow clean in half! Two and 1/2 inches from the arrow point, he had severed another of his arrows inside the hanging ball - Tony was there, ask him!

We introduced the new Robin Hood challenge to the decathlon.  
This was met with ooohs and aaaahs as the new setup gives everybody a chance to enter the shoot off at the end of the day.

Finalists for the Robin Hood shoot off were Roger, John, Tony and Dean.

These archers had the highest individual score from either round on the 122cm target.  
Similar to a Lancaster archery finals setup, 4<sup>th</sup> place plays 3, winner plays 2, winner plays 1.

Dean was heralded by all in attendance as the decathlon supreme champion, taking out the overall highest score and Robin Hood perpetual trophy.

A massive thank you to all that came to the event and helped with the pack up or set up.  
It takes an army to make this happen, both dad and I appreciate your help.

The day is only ever going to enjoy continued success with the support of our members.
